



Welcome to SeaCity Museum!

The museum opened on April 10th 2012, exactly 100 years since the RMS Titanic left Southampton on her first and only journey.



This museum tells the stories of people who have lived, worked, and travelled through Southampton since prehistoric times. The city has long been a safe place for people to visit and settle, so there are a lot of different stories to tell.

Southampton has been home to many different shipping companies, all of them transporting people to and from the city for almost 200 years. The most famous of these was the RMS Titanic, which left Southampton in 1912. The exhibition *Southampton's Titanic Story* tells the story of the crew of Titanic, most of them came from Southampton. The people who sailed on RMS Titanic were heading to America, and a lot of them were going to start a new life. When you visit the exhibition, you'll learn what jobs the crew did, what it was like to work on the ship, and all about the sinking.

Southampton: Gateway to the World is an exhibition which tells the stories of the people who lived, worked, and settled in Southampton for thousands of years. You'll learn about Roman traders, Saxon settlers, Medieval traders, and some of the many people who have made a life in Southampton since the Second World War.

The last exhibition at SeaCity is *Southampton Stories*, where several different stories are told about the history of Southampton. The exhibition focuses on topics like sports, Southampton during the Wars, ships, and daily life.
